'Sentences'

A Sentence is a group of words that tells a complete thought. It expresses a complete idea or ask question by telling who or what and what is or what happens. A sentence begins with a capital letter and end with a full stop(.) question mark(?) or exclamation mark(!).

For example:

- (a) Ali is a hip hop dancer.
- (b) The flour mill caught fire.

Parts of a Sentence

A Sentence contains a subject and a predicate

Subject - It represents the person or thing (doer) who performs the action of the verb.

Predicate - It tells us who or what the subject is or does.

for example: The horse galloped across the meadow.
